- Show your work.

➤ When class ends:

- Clean your desk area and the floor around your area.
- Do not leave until the teacher dismisses you.

Grading Policy

Each marking period there will be formal tests, quizzes (announced and unannounced), warm-up activities, classwork, and homework assignments. There will also be other types of informal assessments to periodically check for understanding. District wide assessments will also be administered throughout.

Homework

- Parents, your child will always receive written and oral directions for all class work, homework, and tests.
- > Time will be given in class to write down their daily assignments in their planner.

Absences

Excessive absences should be avoided. In the event of an absence, the student is required to make up class and homework assignments. Any student that is absent should check with me immediately upon their return to school. Students will be given one day for each absent day to make up work.
